# A festival's impact on **Ipswich**

Celebrating Ipswich's diversity has remained firmly at the core of the Multicultural Festival

mainstay of the town's summer calendar, the festival has evolved over the years.
The first iterations of the One

Big Multicultural

Festival date back nearly three decades ago when it was known as the Annual Bangladeshi Community Day and held indoors at the New Wolsey Theatre.

After growing in popularity and attendance it was decided to rebrand the event when it became known as the Big Multicultural

Festival 13 years ago. Since 2012, the event has been held annually at Alexandra Park, Ipswich, with around 8,000 people of diverse backgrounds attending the festival every year.

The festival showcases cultural diversity through music, food and sports, as well as hosting more than 40 stalls inside information marquee.

Councillor Sandy Martin, leader of Labour Group at Suffolk County Council, said: "When we see in the media some of the divisions, misunderstandings and hatred stirred up between people from different countries, ethnic backgrounds, political and religious traditions, it would be easy to despair.



# Impacting lives for nearly 30 years

Looking back on nearly three decades with immense pride, the charity has been at the heart of creating impactful projects for communities living across Suffolk, Clarissa Place reports

ime does fly when you are dedicated to help your BSCMS was established in 1998 by a group of local volunteers including the late Azizur Rahman, AKM

Mahbubul Alam, the late Jill Stewart, Syed Junab Robbani, Boshor Ali and Mahbub Alam Shamim. among others.

The team have been based at the Grade I listed building in Tower Street since they opened and the building underwent its first renovation in a quarter of a century this year thanks to funding from the National Lottery and the Rope Trust to improve rooms on the ground and first floor.

Mr Ali, who is chair of the group, said, "Founders of the charity felt there was a gap in social, educational, health and wellbeing, and capacity building services and provisions for growing ethnic minority people in Ipswich and Suffolk.

We had no idea how successful we would be.

As it has grown, BSCMS has planned and delivered numerous innovative and impactful projects, which has benefited tens of thousands of people across

Suffolk.

This includes drop-in support services, training project, carers project, befriending scheme, supplementary school, sports project, Global Food & Pita Festival, the annual Multicultural

Festival and Suffolk BME

Business Awards. 27 years later, BSCMS 'has become a valuable charity in Suffolk, working collaboratively with statutory and voluntary organisations to provide help and support to local people,' noted Mahbub Alam

Shamim, Treasurer of BSCMS. "I want to thank our present and previous trustees for their dedication and commitment", he added.

Among the current trustees are Julie Begum, Moshud Ali, Koysor Miah, Howard Pugh and Manik
